Natural Medicine Week, 22-28 May 2017, returns for a second year, aiming to promote, educate and raise awareness of the important role natural medicine practitioners play in improving the health and wellbeing of Australians.

The Australian Traditional-Medicine Society (ATMS), Australia's largest national professional association for natural medicine practitioners, presents a week-long event - the only one of its kind - featuring a range of local workshops, clinic open days and special offers.

Charles Wurf, CEO of ATMS, commented on the need for natural medicine to be understood and explored in every household.

"Following the success of the inaugural Natural Medicine Week in 2016, ATMS is thrilled to bring it back for a second year – to support our practitioners and to continue to raise awareness of natural medicine and the positive impact it has on Australians health and wellbeing," Mr Wurf said.

ATMS has more than 10,000 members who are qualified, accredited, professional practitioners of natural medicine working to help Australians achieve good health every day. This year ATMS practitioners will take part by hosting events and holding workshops in their local community with a phenomenal 70 events and special offers confirmed.

In 2016, ATMS conducted a consumer survey during Natural Medicine Week, finding that **93.85%** of the sample had consulted a natural medicine practitioner, while **96.61%** of participants describe natural medicine as 'effective or very effective.' This year ATMS will again conduct a survey to gain insights into consumers' views on natural medicine.

Natural Medicine Week will take part from 22 May – 28 May 2017.
